PUBLIC INPUT

Chet Ellsworth from Rapid City appeared before the board to discuss what he stated as violations of the open meetings laws regarding the Davison County Insurance Committee and the presentation of the proposed county ordinance to combine the offices of Treasurer and Auditor into a County Finance Office.

Chairperson Reider responded stating the insurance committee does not handle litigation, instead is a group focused on employee benefits, and that it does not take any official action, as that all has to come through the Board of Commissioners.

At 9:20 a.m., motion by Blaalid, second by Nebelsick to open the public hearing regarding a temporary special event for the Stickney Community Foundation for an event at the Davison County Fairgrounds to be held on August 24, 2024. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

GRANT TEMPORARY SPECIAL EVENT MALT BEVERAGE LICENSE

Davison County Resolution #082024-01 Grant Temporary Special-Event Malt Beverage License to Stickney Community Foundation Inc of Stickney, SD

Whereas, SDCL 35-4-124 states, in part, that any municipality or county may issue:

- (1) A special malt beverage retailers license in conjunction with a special event within the municipality or county to any civic, charitable, educational, fraternal, or veterans organization or licensee licensed pursuant to 35-1-111 or subdivision 35-4-2(4), (6) or (16) in addition to any other licenses held by the special events license applicant;
- (2) A special on-sale license in conjunction with a special event within the municipality or county to any civic, charitable, educational, fraternal, or veterans organization or any licensee licensed pursuant to 35-4-111 or subdivision 35-4-2(4) or (6) in addition to any other licenses held by the special events license applicant; and

Whereas, a public hearing is required for the issuance of a license pursuant to this section if the person/organization applying for the license doesn't hold an on-sale alcoholic beverage license or a retail malt beverage license in the municipality or county; and

Whereas, no persons appeared at the hearing held August 20, 2024, in objection to the issuance of the malt beverage license applied for and no concerns were otherwise expressed, it being noted the location and particulars of the temporarily licensed premises were appropriate for the sale of malt beverages; and

Whereas, the fee had previously been set at \$200.00.

Now, therefore, be it resolved, that a temporary special-event on-sale malt beverage license be issued to Stickney Community Foundation Inc, for a fee of \$200 for the day of August 24, 2024, for a special-event at the Davison County Fairgrounds, which is legally described as SW ¼ RY & Ex LT 1 of Davison County Sub in SE ¼ of SW ¼, Mitchell Township, Davison County, South Dakota.

Davison County Resolution #082024-02 Support of Ripples of Change White Paper

Whereas, the Rural Water Center Inc. and South Dakota Association of Rural Water Systems with significance contributions from other stakeholders and collaborators has prepared the Ripples of Change White Paper dated June 20, 2024 with the intention of increasing awareness of South Dakota's Water Resources; and

Whereas, due to extreme water shortages across the western United States, many states have been looking of alternative water sources to supplement their water needs; and

Whereas, to build a more resilient South Dakota, we must identify, plan, and implement the beneficial use of our existing resources for future drinking water, agricultural irrigation development, and industrial growth; and

Whereas, water is a vital resource for future growth of the state and South Dakota's unmet Pick Sloan authorization present an opportunity to secure water supply that could greatly benefit South Dakota's economy; and

Whereas, the current challenges to develop South Dakota's water resources include data availability, understanding water availability, funding, and governmental structure that proactively fosters development; and

Whereas, it is difficult to have governmental structure that truly fosters water development if there is not substantial funding allocated to development; and

Whereas, all signs currently indicate that water scarcity in the western United States has brought attention to the Missouri River it is imperative that South Dakota establish water rights and develop systems to put water to beneficial use.

Now, therefore, be it resolved, that the Davison County Board of Commissioners supports the sentiments and recommendations outlined in the Ripples of Change White paper including funding for the future, establishing the future needs and growth opportunities for South Dakota, empowering a governing body to facilitate water development in the state, update water resource studies, and develop a water resources data clearinghouse or datacenter.
